A shim approximately 1/4" (6.4 mm) wide by 1 3/4" (44.5 mm) long by .010" (0.25 mm) thick will allow you to raise the action approximately 1/32" (0.8 mm). For guitars with the Micro-Tilt adjustment, loosen the two neck screws on both sides of the adjustment access hole on the neckplate by at least four full turns.

Selecting your strings is crucial, because a Stratocaster should be set up with the actual string gauge that you intend to use. The core diameter and tension of your strings determine how the Strat's spring claw must be set - which in turn carries over to saddle heights, intonation adjustment and truss rod tension.

Start by setting all of your guitar pickups to 3/32" (0.095" - 2.38mm) on the bass side and 2/32" (1/16", 0.0625", 1.98mm) on the treble side. Remember, this is the space between the top of the pole piece and the bottom of the string, held down at the last fret.

Sight a Guitar Neck. 1. Tune the guitar to pitch. 2. Turn the guitar on its side, close one eye, and look down the neck from the headstock towards the bridge (left). 3. Look down the profile of the fretboard on both the bass and treble sides of the neck.Is the neck straight or is there a curve?. Upbow & Backbow. Because the truss rod will affect the middle of the neck most, be sure to pay ...

A common "Fender-style" bridge on a Stratocaster On electric guitars, adjusting the saddle height is usually a simple matter of carefully measuring the height and then using a screwdriver or allen wrench (depending on the bridge) to raise the strings appropriately. Unfortunately, acoustic guitars present a far more challenging situation.

Place a capo on the first fret. Then go through the process of adjusting the saddles with the bass side at 5/64" and treble at 4/64". Then lower the middle four strings using the under-saddle radius gauge as your guide. After making these adjustments, you can put the guitar back up to pitch.
