Parent-child story hours. Some libraries invite parents to bring in their children – no matter how young – for special programs, such as parent-child story hours in the evening. Here parents can learn fingerplays, songs, rhymes, and other activities they can use at home to entertain and stimulate their infants.

Beyond Books: Library Services for Children | Reading Rockets

Many libraries also loan out toys for children up to about 6 years old. Types of toys you'll find might include puzzles, baby dolls, farm animals, and music makers. Libraries typically loan out one or two toys at a time per child or per library card, and you get to take these toys home for a period of about one to three weeks.
