4 Strategies for Teaching Vocabulary to your Students ...

Dual coding - making connections between text and visuals - is a learning strategy. Teaching strategies (methods) that could apply dual coding might be mind mapping, brainstorming, doodling, sketching, diagramming, etc. Another example: Retrieval practice is a learning strategy and a teaching strategy that applies to this could be a brain dump.
